Product Installation Overview

CPU holder installation focuses on cable hole layout, wire path protection, access position, grommet fit, and low-voltage cable routing in the Office Furniture Hardware and Desk Fittings panel.

For B2B furniture production, use this CPU holder guide to standardize marking, drilling, mounting, fastening, and final inspection before the hardware is approved for cabinet, panel, or furniture assembly.

Important installation note:

This is only a simple installation tutorial. Specific adjustments should be made according to the actual furniture, panel material, and hardware specifications.

Use these installation signals to prepare tools, verify measurements, and avoid common alignment or fastening mistakes before production use.

- **Tools to prepare:** tape measure, pencil, drill, hole saw and screwdriver Prepare these before drilling or fastening the hardware.
- **Measurement checks:** cut-out size, hole diameter, desktop thickness and cable path Confirm these measurements against the panel, door, drawer, or frame before installation.
- **Hardware and supplies:** CPU holder, wire channel and low-voltage cable clips Check compatibility with the actual furniture material and order specification.
- **Step sequence:** Plan the cable, Mark cut-out or fixing holes, Drill or cut the required opening, Install the fitting and secure it and Route cables or test mechanical movement Follow the sequence so alignment errors are caught before final tightening.

Detailed CPU holder Installation Tutorial

Before You Start

Before installing CPU holder, dry-fit CPU holder on the furniture part and confirm the cut-out size reference. Mark from one clean datum edge, not from a damaged corner, so repeated pieces land in the same position. Plan the cable exit, service access, hole size, and any moving hardware that could pinch wires.

Installation Method

During the CPU holder work, use tape measure first, then drill or fasten gradually. Keep the hardware square to the panel, leave adjustment screws loose until alignment is checked, and compare the result with the Office Furniture and Cable Management Installation profile requirements. Cut clean openings, protect edges, and route cables with slack and strain relief where needed.

Final Check

After CPU holder is mounted, operate, pull, load, or lock the part in the same direction a user will use it. Recheck gaps, screw seating, clearance, and surface damage before approving the CPU holder installation for production. Pull cables through the path and check abrasion, cover fit, and socket or switch access.

Visual Step-by-Step Installation Guide

Step 1 of 6: Plan the cable, lock, slide, or accessory position

Step by Step Installation Instructions

1. 1

Plan the cable, lock, slide, or accessory position For CPU holder, mark the cable exit, access direction, and safe distance from drawers, hinges, or slides. Use tape measure for this operation and keep "cut-out size" as the main measurement check. Keep CPU holder in position without fully forcing it until the alignment is verified. Before moving to the next step, confirm the reference line is visible, repeatable, and matches the product title and drawing requirement.

2. 2

Mark cut-out or fixing holes For CPU holder, cut or drill the cable opening with edge protection in mind and clear all sharp chips. Use pencil for this operation and keep "hole diameter" as the main measurement check. Keep wire channel in position without fully forcing it until the alignment is verified. Before moving to the next step, confirm the hole, cutout, or prepared surface is

clean and does not break through the finished face.

3. 3

Drill or cut the required opening For CPU holder, fit the grommet, cover, socket, or cable guide before pulling the final cable bundle. Use drill for this operation and keep "desktop thickness" as the main measurement check. Keep low-voltage cable clips in position without fully forcing it until the alignment is verified. Before moving to the next step, confirm the hardware sits flush against the panel without rocking or twisting.

4. 4

Install the fitting and secure it For CPU holder, secure covers and guides while leaving enough slack for service access. Use hole saw for this operation and keep "cable path" as the main measurement check. Keep CPU holder in position without fully forcing it until the alignment is verified. Before moving to the next step, confirm fasteners are seated firmly without stripping, crushing, or shifting the hardware.

5. 5

Route cables or test mechanical movement For CPU holder, route cables away from pinch points and check that covers sit flush. Use screwdriver for this operation and keep "tray length" as the main measurement check. Keep wire channel in position without fully forcing it until the alignment is verified. Before moving to the next step, confirm the gap, reveal, height, and working clearance are even from the front and side.

6. 6

Check clearance, access, and user comfort For CPU holder, pull the cable path by hand and verify there is no abrasion or blocked access. Use cable ties for this operation and keep "clearance" as the main measurement check. Keep low-voltage cable clips in position without fully forcing it until the alignment is verified. Before moving to the next step, confirm movement, holding strength, and safety are acceptable before production approval.

Common Installation Mistakes

- Cutting the CPU holder opening before checking cable exit direction.
- Leaving sharp edges around the cable path.
- Routing wires where drawers, hinges, or slides can pinch them.
- Ignoring service access for switches or sockets.

Safety and Installation Warnings

- Keep cable paths away from sharp edges and moving hardware.
- Wear eye protection and confirm all measurements before drilling.

Adjustment or Testing Notes

- Pull cable through CPU holder and check for abrasion points.
- Confirm the cover or profile sits flush.
- Verify switch or socket access remains clear.

Installation FAQ

What tools are needed to install CPU holder?

Typical tools include tape measure, pencil, drill, hole saw, screwdriver. For production work, add jigs, depth stops, or templates when repeatable positioning is required.

What measurements should be checked before installing CPU holder?

Check cut-out size, hole diameter, desktop thickness, cable path, tray length before drilling or fastening. Confirm dimensions against the product drawing and panel thickness.

Can CPU holder be installed in MDF or plywood furniture?

Most furniture hardware can be installed in MDF, plywood, particle board, or solid wood when the pilot hole, screw length, load rating, and tightening torque match the material.

What is the most common installation mistake for CPU holder?

Cutting the CPU holder opening before checking cable exit direction.
