Product Installation Overview

Worktop Edging installation depends on clean edge preparation, straight alignment, adhesive or screw line control, trimming direction, corner finishing, and surface protection on the Edge Banding, Trim, Profiles, and Decorative Components panel.

For B2B furniture production, use this Worktop Edging guide to standardize marking, drilling, mounting, fastening, and final inspection before the hardware is approved for cabinet, panel, or furniture assembly.

Important installation note:

This is only a simple installation tutorial. Specific adjustments should be made according to the actual furniture, panel material, and hardware specifications.

Use these installation signals to prepare tools, verify measurements, and avoid common alignment or fastening mistakes before production use.

- **Tools to prepare:** tape measure, cutter, adhesive or iron if applicable, roller and file or trimmer Prepare these before drilling or fastening the hardware.
- **Measurement checks:** panel thickness, profile length, edge radius and adhesive width Confirm these measurements against the panel, door, drawer, or frame before installation.
- **Hardware and supplies:** Worktop Edging, adhesive or screws and corner cap when required Check compatibility with the actual furniture material and order specification.
- **Step sequence:** Clean and square the panel edge, Measure and cut edge banding, Apply adhesive or align mechanical fixing, Press the profile or banding onto the edge and Trim excess and finish corners Follow the sequence so alignment errors are

caught before final tightening.

Worktop Edging

Detailed Worktop Edging Installation Tutorial

Before You Start

Before installing Worktop Edging, dry-fit Worktop Edging on the furniture part and confirm the panel thickness reference. Mark from one clean datum edge, not from a damaged corner, so repeated pieces land in the same position. Clean and dry the edge, check profile length, dry-fit corners, and protect finished surfaces.

Installation Method

During the Worktop Edging work, use tape measure first, then drill or fasten gradually. Keep the hardware square to the panel, leave adjustment screws loose until alignment is checked, and compare the result with the Edge Banding, Trim, and Profile Installation profile requirements. Align from one end, press or fasten evenly, and trim away from the finished face.

Final Check

After Worktop Edging is mounted, operate, pull, load, or lock the part in the same direction a user will use it. Recheck gaps, screw seating, clearance, and surface damage before approving the Worktop Edging installation for production. Inspect corners, end caps, adhesive cure, and any sharp or lifted edge before use.

Visual Step-by-Step Installation Guide

Step 1 of 6: Clean and square the panel edge

Step by Step Installation Instructions

1. 1

Clean and square the panel edge For Worktop Edging, mark profile length, corner direction, and end finish on a clean protected edge. Use tape measure for this operation and keep "panel thickness" as the main measurement check. Keep Worktop Edging in position without fully forcing it until the alignment is verified. Before moving to the next step, confirm the reference line is visible, repeatable, and matches the product title and drawing requirement.

2. 2

Measure and cut edge banding, trim, or profile to length For Worktop Edging, prepare the edge by cleaning, sanding, or dry-fitting before adhesive or fasteners. Use cutter for this operation and keep "profile length" as the main measurement check. Keep adhesive or screws in position without fully forcing it until the alignment is verified. Before moving to the next step, confirm the hole, cutout, or prepared surface is clean and does not break through the finished face.

3. 3

Apply adhesive or align mechanical fixing For Worktop Edging, place the profile from one end and keep the visible line straight along the panel. Use adhesive or iron if applicable for this operation and keep "edge radius" as the main measurement check. Keep corner cap when required in position without fully forcing it until the alignment is verified. Before moving to the next step, confirm the hardware sits flush against the panel without rocking or twisting.

4. 4

Press the profile or banding onto the edge For Worktop Edging, press, clamp, screw, or bond the profile evenly without waves or gaps. Use roller for this operation and keep "adhesive width" as the main measurement check. Keep Worktop Edging in position without fully forcing it until the alignment is verified. Before moving to the next step, confirm fasteners are seated firmly without stripping, crushing, or shifting the hardware.

5. 5

Trim excess and finish corners For Worktop Edging, trim ends, finish corners, and remove squeeze-out before it hardens. Use file or trimmer for this operation and keep "trim allowance" as the main measurement check. Keep adhesive or screws in position without fully forcing it until the alignment is verified. Before moving to the next step, confirm the gap, reveal, height, and working clearance are even from the front and side.

6. 6

Inspect adhesion, alignment, and visible gaps For Worktop Edging, run a hand along the edge and check for sharp points, lifting, or unfinished ends. Use tape measure for this operation and keep "panel thickness" as the main measurement check. Keep corner cap when required in position without fully forcing it until the alignment is verified. Before moving to the next step, confirm movement, holding strength, and safety are acceptable before production approval.

Common Installation Mistakes

- Applying Worktop Edging to a dusty or uneven edge.
- Starting alignment without a dry fit.
- Trimming toward the finished surface.
- Ignoring corner caps or end finishing.

Safety and Installation Warnings

- Poor surface preparation causes lifting or visible gaps over time.
- Wear eye protection and confirm all measurements before drilling.

Adjustment or Testing Notes

- Run a hand along Worktop Edging to check for lifting or sharp edges.
- Inspect corners and ends for a finished appearance.
- Confirm adhesive or fastener hold after curing or tightening.

Installation FAQ

What tools are needed to install Worktop Edging?

Typical tools include tape measure, cutter, adhesive or iron if applicable, roller, file or trimmer. For production work, add jigs, depth stops, or templates when repeatable positioning is required.

What measurements should be checked before installing Worktop Edging?

Check panel thickness, profile length, edge radius, adhesive width, trim allowance before drilling or fastening. Confirm dimensions against the product drawing and panel thickness.

Can Worktop Edging be installed in MDF or plywood furniture?

Most furniture hardware can be installed in MDF, plywood, particle board, or solid wood when the pilot hole, screw length, load rating, and tightening torque match the material.

What is the most common installation mistake for Worktop Edging?

Applying Worktop Edging to a dusty or uneven edge.
